



CREATE A HUMAN RIGHTS/SOCIAL JUSTICE PROJECT; YOUR STUDENTS COULD WIN PRIZES...

If you assign a written, visual, or digital project related to human rights and social justice in fall semester, your students could win one of 21 prizes of \$100 a piece. The contest is open to all Miami students on all campuses.

Contest Categories

- Research papers and essays
- Op-Ed commentaries
- Journalism
- Creative writing
- Photos accompanied by explanatory statements
- Posters
- Electronic media (e.g., websites, digital movies)

In addition, there will be three special awards for entries in any category that are based on a student's international study or service.

Assignment Ideas

No matter what your department—whether art, education, engineering, or zoology—there are many human rights and social justice issues that your students can address. Students may highlight successful social justice initiatives as well as propose solutions or raise awareness of problems that need to be tackled. Students may address global topics or local ones—including ones right here at Miami.

Submissions

Student may submit their entries from **October 1 through 31** at www.muohio.edu/Howe. The website provides additional contest details. Winners will be announced at the Human Rights and Social Justice Fair on November 14, so you can celebrate your students' achievements before the semester ends.
